Fall Craft Show Concession Stand

Hello Ladies,

We are going to try a different set-up for concession stand workers for the Fall Craft Show. I am requesting that you sign-up to work a particular station for a time slot. The idea behind this is that to be in compliance with the Health Department regulations for food service, it is very important that anyone handling food must be wearing protective gloves. The difficulty with wearing gloves is the constant on and off or contamination because of moving around getting drinks, getting a sandwich, etc. With changing the set up, each worker would only be responsible for handling what they are handling in their station.

There are still several items on the list that need to be donated. You may email me at <u>lbrown@pfh.org</u> to let me know what you would like to bring or to sign-up to be a worker. I will send out an updated concession stand list the week of October 17th for your review. In addition, the final sign-up sheet will be available at the general membership meeting on October 27th.

I can't remind you all often enough, that it is YOUR generosity that enables our club to have a successful concession stand, which in turns, helps us supplement the needs in our community. Remember that this year's concession stand profits will benefit

Thanks so much for your help and donations!

Here are some quick and basic food safety reminders for the concession stand:

- 1. No children or non-members in the kitchen.
- 2. No eating food while in the kitchen.
- 3. Wear gloves at all food/drink stations.
- 4. Wash hands when coming into the kitchen. If you step out to shop or go to the bathroom, wash your hands when returning to the kitchen.
- 5. Do not touch the rim of the beverage cups and use the ice scoop to put ice in the cups. And put ice scoop back in its holder.
- 6. Do not put your purse or purchases on a surface used for serving food.
- 7. Don't be in the kitchen if you're sick!
